

Unica Centralized Offer Management V12.1.8 Installation Guide



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Chapter 1. Installation overview

The installation of HCL Unica products is complete when you install, configure, and deploy the HCL Unica products. The Installation Guide provides detailed information about installing, configuring, and deploying the products.

How the installers work

You must use the suite installer and the product installer when you install any Unica product. For example, for installing Unica Platform and Unica Centralized Offer Management, you must use the Unica suite installer and the Unica Centralized Offer Management installer.

Make sure that you use the following guidelines before you use the Unica suite installer and the product installer:

- The suite installer and the product installer must be in the same directory on the computer where you want to install the product. When multiple versions of a product installer are present in the directory with the master installer, the master installer always shows the latest version of the product on the Unica products screen in the installation wizard.
- The default top-level directory for Unica installations is `/root/HCL/Unica` for UNIX™ or `C:\HCL\Unica` for Microsoft® Windows®. However, you can change the directory during installation.

Modes of installation

The Unica suite installer can run in one of the following modes: GUI mode / X Window System mode, Console mode, or Silent mode (also called the unattended mode). Select a mode that suits your requirements when you install Unica Centralized Offer Management.

GUI mode or X Window System mode

To install Unica Centralized Offer Management using the GUI mode, use:

- the GUI mode for Microsoft Windows
- the X Window System mode for UNIX

Console mode

To install Unica Centralized Offer Management in console mode, use the command line window.



Note: To display the Installer screens correctly in console mode, configure your terminal software to support `UTF-8` character encoding. Other character encoding, such as ANSI, will not render the text correctly, and some information will not be readable.

Silent mode

To install Unica Centralized Offer Management multiple times, use the silent mode or the unattended mode. The silent mode uses response files for installation. It does not require user input during the installation process.

Chapter 2. Planning Unica Centralized Offer Management installation

When you plan your Unica Centralized Offer Management installation, ensure that you have set up your system correctly, and that you have configured your environment to deal with any failures.

Prerequisites

Before you install a Unica product, you must ensure that your computer complies with all the prerequisite software and hardware.

System requirements

For information about system requirements, see the *Recommended Software Environments and Minimum System Requirements* guide.

Network domain requirements

The Unica products that are installed as a suite must be installed on the same network domain to comply with the browser restrictions that are designed to limit the security risks that can occur with cross-site scripting.

JVM requirements

Unica applications within a suite must be deployed on a dedicated Java™ virtual machine (JVM). You can deploy Unica Centralized Offer Management on a dedicated JVM, or you can deploy it in the same JVM of Unica Platform and Unica Campaign.

Knowledge requirements

To install Unica products, you must have a thorough knowledge of the environment in which the products are installed. This knowledge includes knowledge about operating systems, databases, and web application servers.

Internet browser settings

Make sure that your internet browser complies with the following settings:

- The browser must not cache web pages.
- The browser must not block pop-up windows.

Access permissions

Verify that you have the following network permissions to complete the installation tasks:

- Administration access for all necessary databases



Note: Administrator must have `CREATE`, `SELECT`, `INSERT`, `UPDATE`, `DELETE`, and `DROP` rights for both tables and views.

- Read and write access to the relevant directory and sub-directories for the operating system account that you use to run the web application server and Unica components
- Write permission for all files that you must edit
- Write permission for all directories where you must save a file, such as the installation directory and backup directory if you are upgrading
- Appropriate read, write, and execute permissions to run the installer

Verify that you have the administrative password for your web application server.

For UNIX™, all installer files for products must have full permissions, for example, `rwrx-xr-x`.

The following additional permissions are necessary for UNIX™:

- The user account that installs Centralized Offer Management and Unica Platform must be a member of the same group as the Unica Centralized Offer Management users. This user account must have a valid home directory and have write permissions for that directory.
- All installer files for HCL Marketing Software products must have full permissions, for example, `rwrx-xr-x`.

Points to consider before you install Unica Centralized Offer Management

For Unica Centralized Offer Management installation, you are required to consider the following points.

JAVA_HOME environment variable

If a `JAVA_HOME` environment variable is defined on the computer where you install a Unica product, verify that the variable points to a supported version of JRE. For information about system requirements, see the *Recommended Software Environments and Minimum System Requirements* guide.

If the `JAVA_HOME` environment variable points to an incorrect JRE, you must clear the `JAVA_HOME` variable before you run the Unica installers.

You can clear the `JAVA_HOME` environment variable by using one of the following methods:

- Windows™: In a command window, enter `set JAVA_HOME=` (leave empty) and press **Enter**.
- UNIX™: In the terminal, enter `export JAVA_HOME=` (leave empty) and press **Enter**.

You can clear the `JAVA_HOME` environment variable by running the following command in the terminal:

```
export JAVA_HOME= (leave empty)
```

The Unica installer installs a JRE in the top-level directory for the Unica installation. Individual Unica application installers do not install a JRE. Instead, they point to the location of the JRE that is installed by the Unica installer. You can reset the environment variable after all installations are complete.

For more information about the supported JRE, see the *Recommended Software Environments and Minimum System Requirements* guide.

Unica Platform and Unica Campaign requirements

You must install, or upgrade to, version 12.1 of Unica Platform and Unica Campaign before you install or upgrade any Unica products. For each group of products that work together, you must install or upgrade Unica Platform only once. Each product installer checks whether the required products are installed. If your product or version is not registered with Unica Platform, a message prompts you to install or upgrade Unica Platform before you proceed with your installation. Unica Platform must be deployed and running before you can set any properties on the **Settings > Configuration** page.



Note: For versions 12.0.0 and higher, ensure that you do not select the database type Informix as it is not functional. From version 12.1.0.3 and higher, users can use OneDB database as system table and user tables. See the *Unica V12.1.0.3 with OneDB as System Tables Guide* for more details.

Installation order for Unica products

When you install or upgrade multiple Unica products, you must install them in a specific order.

The following table provides information about the order that you must follow when you install or upgrade multiple Unica products.

Where to install Unica Centralized Offer Management and Unica Platform

Unica Centralized Offer Management: You can install Unica Centralized Offer Management on its own machine, where no other Unica products are installed, or on a machine that it shares with Unica Platform.

Unica Platform: The Unica Platform application contains the common navigation, reporting, user administration, security, scheduling, and configuration management features. For each Unica environment, you must install and deploy the Unica Platform once.

Chapter 3. Configuring the web application server for your JDBC driver

The web application server where you plan to deploy Unica Centralized Offer Management must contain the correct JAR file to support JDBC connections. This enables your web application to connect to the system tables. The location of the JAR file must be included in the class path of the web application server.

About this task

If you are using WebSphere and WebLogic, you can skip the steps in this procedure about setting the class path.

If you are using WebLogic, you must perform this entire procedure.



Note: If you are installing Unica Centralized Offer Management on the same machine where you installed Unica Platform, this task is already complete. Continue to [Creating JDBC connections in the web application server on page 6](#).

1. Obtain the latest Type 4 JDBC drivers and any required associated files (for example, Oracle requires several associated files) for the database you plan to use. See the *Recommended Software Environments and Minimum System Requirements* guide for details.

You should always use the latest vendor-provided Type 4 driver.

- If the driver does not exist on the machine where Unica Centralized Offer Management will be installed, obtain it, and copy it to any location on the Unica Centralized Offer Management machine.
 - If you obtain the driver from a machine where the database client is installed, verify that the version is the latest supplied by the database vendor. See your consultant for a list of supported JDBC drivers.
2. Include the full path to the driver in the `CLASSPATH` of the web application server where you plan to deploy Unica Centralized Offer Management, as follows.
 - For all supported versions of WebLogic, add the `jar` files to the `CLASSPATH` variable in `DOMAIN_DIR\bin\setDomainEnv.cmd`. Yours must be the first entry of the `CLASSPATH` values to ensure that the web application server uses the correct driver. For example, if you are using SQL Server you might set the path as follows.

```
set CLASSPATH=c:\SQLDRIVER\sqljdbc.jar;%PRE_CLASSPATH%;%WEBLOGIC_CLASSPATH%;%POST_CLASSPATH%;%WLP_POST_CLASSPATH%
```

- For all supported versions of WebSphere®, set the `CLASSPATH` in the Administration Console.

Creating JDBC connections in the web application server

The Unica Centralized Offer Management web application uses JDBC connections to communicate with the system table database and with the Unica Platform and Unica Campaign system table database.

About this task

You must create this JDBC connection in the web application server where you plan to deploy Unica Centralized Offer Management. If you are using WebLogic or Tomcat, you must add the JDBC driver to your class path manually. The installer does this automatically for WebSphere.



Important: For the connection to the database holding the Unica Platform system tables, you must use `UnicaPlatformDS` as the JNDI name. For the connection to the database holding the Unica Campaign system tables, you must use `campaignPartition1DS` as the JNDI name. If Campaign has multiple partitions, we will need the datasources for all the partitions of Campaign. These are the required JNDI names.

If you expect to have many concurrent users in Unica Centralized Offer Management, you may need to increase the number of connections in your web server. For best results, set your web server to allow 50 connections.

Information for creating JDBC connections

Use default values when you create JDBC connections if specific values are not provided. For more information, see the application server documentation.



Note:

- If you are not using the default port setting for your database, make sure that you change it to the correct value.

WebLogic

Use the following values if your application server is WebLogic:

SQLServer

- Database Driver: Microsoft™ MS SQL Server Driver 2014, 2016 SP1, 2017
- Default port: 1433
- Driver class: `com.microsoft.sqlserver.jdbc.SQLServerDriver`
- Driver URL: `jdbc:sqlserver://<your_db_host>[\<named_instance>]:<your_db_port>;databaseName=<your_db_name>`
- Properties: Add `user=<your_db_user_name>`

Oracle

- Driver: Other
- Default port: 1521
- Driver class: `oracle.jdbc.OracleDriver`
- Driver URL: `jdbc:oracle:thin:@<your_db_host>:<your_db_port>:<your_db_service_name>`

Enter the driver URL by using the format that is shown. Unica applications do not allow the use of Oracle's RAC (Real Application Cluster) format for JDBC connections.

- Properties: Add `user=<your_db_user_name>`

DB2®

- Driver: Other
- Default port: 50000
- Driver class: `com.ibm.db2.jcc.DB2Driver`
- Driver URL: `jdbc:db2://<your_db_host>:<your_db_port>/<your_db_name>`
- Properties: Add `user=<your_db_user_name>`

MariaDB

- Driver: `org.mariadb.jdbc.Driver`
- Default port: 3306
- Driver class: `com.ibm.db2.jcc.DB2Driver`
- Driver URL: `jdbc:mysql://hostname:port/databaseName`

PostgreSQL

- Database type: User_define
- Implementation class name = `org.postgresql.ds.PGConnectionPoolDataSource`
- Driver: `postgresql-42.5.4.jar`

JNDI custom properties

- Component-managed authentication alias = Select the authentication details for user
- Mapping-configuration alias = WSLogin
- `portNumber` = 5432

- `user` = the user name of the PostgreSQL server
- `password` = the password associated with the user name

Tomcat

Specify the native library path of the database driver JAR file on your server. For example: `db2jcc4.jar/ojdbc8.jar/sqljdbc-6.4.0.jre8.jar` to create a datasource under Tomcat Interact Instance, add folder hierarchy as `<Tomcat_Home>/conf/Catalina/localhost`, create a xml file with the name `Offer.xml` under localhost folder. Add data source pointing to Runtime, Test, Production, and learning database in `interact.xml`, refer platform or Campaign xml file which is created through installers inside their respective Tomcat instance directory. You will need to create these Data source entry in Campaign Tomcat instance too.



Note: If you want to encrypt password then run utility `encryptTomcatDBPasswords.sh` from `<PLATFORM_HOME>/tools/bin`. To know more about utility, see *Unica Platform Administrator Guide*.

Use the following values if your application server is Tomcat:

- Default port: 1433

- Driver URL: `jdbc:sqlserver://<your_db_host>[\
\<named_instance>]:<your_db_port>;databaseName=<your_db_name>`

Oracle

- Driver: Oracle JDBC Driver
- Default port: 1521
- Driver class: `oracle.jdbc.OracleDriver`
- Driver URL: `jdbc:oracle:thin:@<your_db_host>:<your_db_port>:<your_db_service_name>`

DB2

- Driver: JCC Driver Provider
- Default port: 50000
- Driver class: `com.ibm.db2.jcc.DB2Driver`

MariaDB

WebSphere®

Use the following values if your application server is WebSphere®:

SQLServer

- Driver: N/A
- Default port: 1433
- Driver class: `com.microsoft.sqlserver.jdbc.SQLServerConnectionPoolDataSource`
- Driver URL: `jdbc:sqlserver://<DBhostName>:1433;databaseName=<DBName>`

In the **Database Type** field, select **User-defined**.

After you create the JDBC Provider and data source, go to the **Custom Properties** for the data source, and add, modify properties as follows.

- `serverName=<your_SQL_server_name>`
- `portNumber =<SQL_Server_Port_Number>`
- `databaseName=<your_database_name>`

Add the following custom property:

Name: `webSphereDefaultIsolationLevel`

Value: 1

Datatype: `Integer`

Oracle

- Driver: Oracle JDBC Driver

MariaDB ODBC driver level configurations

Example for Microsoft Windows: Set the following configuration in ODBC Driver Manager following the **Statements** parameter:

```
SET SQL_MODE='PIPES_AS_CONCAT,ANSI_QUOTES,IGNORE_SPACE,NO_KEY_OPTIONS';
```

Example for SUSE/Linux: Set the following configuration in `odbc.ini`:

```

Driver=/usr/local/mariaDBConnector/lib/libmaodbc.so

Attention: Use MariaDB database user name. Do not use `root` and `unica*03` as username and password for `UA_SYSTEM_TABLES` datasource.

Note: For AIX, we do not support MariaDB as System and User Database.

Chapter 4. Installing Unica Centralized Offer Management

You must run the Unica installer to start the installation of Centralized Offer Management. The Unica installer starts the product installer during the installation process. Make sure that the Unica installer and the product installer are saved at the same location.

Each time that you run the Unica suite installer, you must first enter database connection information for the Platform system tables. When the installer starts, you must enter the required information for Campaign.



Note:

- From V12.1.5 onwards, we can clean install Centralized Offer Management to the latest version i.e. 12.1.8 without installing the base version. If you have upgraded Platform and Campaign to 12.1.8, then you can directly install Centralized Offer Management to the same version without install the base version 12.1.0 first.
- The Unica installer requires information about Platform.
- After completing installation, you can create an EAR file for your product, and you can install the reports package for your product. Creating the EAR file and installing the reports package are not mandatory actions.



Note: To launch the installers on Windows 2019 and Windows 2022, server please set parameter - **SET JAVA_TOOL_OPTIONS="-Dos.name=Windows 7"** - on command prompt and then launch the Installers from the same command prompt.



Important: Before you install Centralized Offer Management, make sure that the available temporary space on the computer where you install Campaign is more than three times the size of the Centralized Offer Management installer.

Installation files

The installation files are named according to the version of the product and the operating system on which they must be installed, except UNIX™. For UNIX™, different installation files exist for the X Window System mode and the console mode.

Example

The following table displays examples of the installation files that are named according to the product version and the operating system:

Installing Unica Centralized Offer Management in GUI mode

For Windows™, use the GUI mode to install Centralized Offer Management. For UNIX™, use the X Window System mode to install Centralized Offer Management.

Before you begin



Important: Before you use the GUI mode to install Centralized Offer Management, make sure that the available temporary space on the computer where you install Centralized Offer Management is more than three times the size of the Centralized Offer Management installer.

Make sure that the Unica installer and the Centralized Offer Management installers are in the same directory on the computer where you want to install Centralized Offer Management.


To install Centralized Offer Management using the GUI mode (for Windows™) or the X Window System mode (for UNIX™):

1. Go to the folder where you have saved the Unica installer and double-click the installer to start it.
2. Click **OK** on the first screen to see the **Introduction** window.
3. Follow the instructions on the installer and click **Next**.

- An application server profile
- A database schema

To display the installer screens correctly in console mode, configure your terminal software to support UTF-8 character encoding. Other character encodings, such as ANSI, do not render the text correctly, and some information is not readable with these encodings.

1. Open a command-line prompt window and navigate to the directory where you have saved the Unica installer and the Interact installer.
2. Complete one of the following actions to run the Unica installer.

Choose from:

- For Windows™, enter the following command:

Unica_installer_full_name -i console
```

For example, HCL_Unica_Installer_12.1.8.0_win.exe -i console

- For UNIX™, invoke the *HCL_Unica_installer_full_name*.sh file.

4. Follow the directions that are displayed in the command-line prompt. Use the following guidelines when you must select an option in the command-line prompt:

5. The Unica installer launches the Unica Platform installer during the installation process. Follow the instructions in the command-line prompt window of the Platform installer.

Note: If any error occurs during the installation, a log file is generated. You must exit the installer to view the log file.

Installing Unica Centralized Offer Management in silent mode

Use the unattended or silent mode to install Unica Centralized Offer Management multiple times.

Before you begin

Before you install Centralized Offer Management, make sure that you have configured the following elements:

- An application server profile
- A database schema

About this task

When you install Unica Centralized Offer Management by using the silent mode, response files are used to obtain the information that is required during installation. You must create response files for a silent installation of your product. You can create response files by using one of the following methods:

- Using the sample response files as a template for creating your response files. The sample response files are included with your product installers in the `ResponseFiles` compressed archive. For more information about sample response files, see [Sample response files on page 23](#).
- Running the product installers in the GUI (Windows™) or X Window System (UNIX™) mode or the console mode before you install the product in the silent mode. One response file is created for the Unica suite installer, and one or more response files are created for your product installer. The files are created in the directory that you specify.



Important: For security reasons, the installer does not save database passwords in the response files.

When you create response files, you must edit each response file to enter database passwords. Open each response file and search for `PASSWORD` to find where you must edit the response file.

When the installer runs in the silent mode, it looks for the response files in the following directories sequentially:

- In the directory where the Unica installer is saved
- In the home directory of the user who installs the product

Make sure that all response files are in the same directory. You can change the path where response files are read by adding arguments to the command line. For example: `-DUNICA_REPLAY_READ_DIR="myDirPath" -f myDirPath/installer.properties`

Use the following command for Windows™:

- `HCL Unica_installer_full_name -i silent`

For example:

Installation prompt windows

During the installation of Unica Centralized Offer Management, several prompt windows display. After you enter the required information, prompt windows display your responses and require a confirmation before you continue. Prompt windows give you the opportunity to make corrections, if needed.

For reference, an example of the prompts that display during installation on a UNIX™ server using console mode follows. Be sure to read and follow the instructions that display during your actual installation.

Use the following example to help you gather required information before you begin your installation and for reference during your installation.

Creating an EAR file after running the installer

You can create an EAR file after you install Unica products. You might do this to create an EAR file with a desired combination of products.

Before you begin

- If you are installing Unica for the first time, ensure that you have made all the required configurations for Centralized Offer Management. For more information, see [Configuration of Unica Centralized Offer Management after deployment on page 41](#).
- Run the installer in console mode from the command line.

About this task

Use the following procedure if you want to create an EAR file after you install Unica products:

1. If this is the first time you are running the installer in console mode, make a backup copy of the installer's `.properties` file for each of your installed products.
 - Each product installer creates one or more response files with a `.properties` extension. These files are in the same directory where you placed the installers. Be sure to back up all files with the `.properties` extension, including the `installer_<product initials><product version number>.properties` files and the file for the installer itself, which is named `installer.properties`.

For example, the properties files for Unica Platform `installer_ump12.1.8.0.properties` and the properties file for Unica Campaign `installer_uo12.1.8.0.properties`.

 - If you plan to run the installer in unattended mode, you must back up the original `.properties` files, because when the installer runs in unattended mode, it clears these files. To create an EAR file, you need the information that the installer writes in the `.properties` files during the initial installation.
2. Open a command window and change directories to the directory that contains the installer.
3. Run the installer executable with this option:

```
-DUNICA_GOTO_CREATEEARFILE=TRUE
```

On UNIX™ type systems, run the `.bin` file rather than the `.sh` file.

The installer wizard runs.

4. Follow the instructions in the wizard.
5. Before you create more EAR files, overwrite the `.properties` file or files with the backups you created before you ran in console mode for the first time. **Please note EAR is not supported for Tomcat application server.**

Custom code generators

If you are using a custom offer code generator (other than `uacoffercodegen` that is bundled with the Centralized Offer Management product), copy these custom code generators, along with all the related DLLs / SOs / EXEs, etc, to the location `<CentralizedOffer_Installation_path>/bin`.

If you have configured a different location for the code generators at `Affinium|Offer|partitions|partition<n>|offerCodeGenerator`, place the code generators in the location configured at `Affinium|Offer|partitions|partition<n>|offerCodeGenerator`.

Chapter 5. Custom validation and offer code plugin configuration

From version 12.1.0.3 onwards, Unica Centralized Offer Management supports offer validation and code generation using Unica Campaign's Plugin Developer's Kit (PDK). For more information on the development and use of the plugin, see *Unica Campaign Validation PDK Guide*.

About this task

If you have already configured the plugin in Unica Campaign, and are using the plugin for Campaign's offers, complete the following steps to use the same plugin in Centralized Offer Management:

1. Before copying the plugin, or plugins, developed in Campaign, take a backup of the validation folder in the `<Unica CentralizedOffer_home>\devkits\ location`.
2. Copy all Campaign plugins from the `<Unica Campaign_home>\devkits\validation\ folder` to `<Unica CentralizedOffer_home>\devkits\validation\ folder`.
 - a. If the Campaign plugins reside in a different folder, copy the plugins from that folder.
 - b. If the Campaign plugins reside in a different folder, complete the following steps:
 - Navigate to **Settings > Configuration**
 - From the **Configuration categories** panel, expand **offer**.
 - Update the configurations in `offer | partitions | partition <n> | validation`. For more information, see *Unica Centralized Offer Management Administrator's Guide*.
 - Update the configurations in `offer | partitions | partition<n> | offerCodeGenerator`. For more information, see *Unica Centralized Offer Management Administrator's Guide*.
3. Restart the Centralized Offer Management application.

Chapter 6. Deploying Unica Centralized Offer Management

There are general guidelines for deploying Unica Centralized Offer Management on WebSphere® and WebLogic.

If you created an EAR file after running the installer and your EAR file includes any other products, you must follow all the deployment guidelines detailed in the individual install guides for the products included in the EAR file in addition to those listed in this chapter.

It is assumed that you know how to work with your web application server. Consult your web application server documentation for details about things like how to use the Administration console.

Chapter 7. Configuration of Unica Centralized Offer Management after deployment

- If you have performed a fresh installation of Unica Campaign and Unica Centralized Offer Management, ensure that the `partition1` node, of Centralized Offer Management, is configured for the datasource `UA_SYSTEM_TABLES` with the Campaign datasource JNDI name. For more information related to this configuration, see the topic **offer | partitions | partition<n> | Data Sources | (Data_Source_Template)** in the *Unica Centralized Offer Management Administrator's Guide*.
- If you change any configuration in Unica Campaign, it requires restarting the Centralized Offer Management application.
- After you deploy and start the Unica Centralized Offer Management application, log in and verify the installation. There are some basic configuration steps such as configuring the system user and a test user.



Note: You can find more system setup tasks in the *Unica Centralized Offer Management Administrator's Guide*.

Google Chrome and Microsoft Edge configuration

Recently, the browsers Google Chrome and Microsoft Edge updated a security fix and this security fix affects the access of Unica applications. We have received some issues from our customers like:

- issues with UI
- unable to edit flowcharts
- getting logged out from Unica

These issues are observed due to the change of behavior in browsers after applying the security fix. Applying the security fix automatically enables **Origin-keyed Agent Clusters by default**. If the setting **Origin-keyed Agent Clusters by default** is enabled automatically, it prevents changes in document referrer and domain values so that malicious websites cannot execute any type of impersonation. The setting **Origin-keyed Agent Clusters by default** existed earlier as well, but was not enabled by default.

If you update Google Chrome or Microsoft Edge to the latest version, you will observe the earlier mentioned issues. Because of how Unica is designed and because the Unica suite is deployed over multiple JVMs, it is essential that you disable the **Origin-keyed Agent Clusters by default** setting for Unica to function correctly and to provide a good user experience.

As a solution, we recommend that you perform the steps mentioned in the following Knowledge Base article: https://support.hcltechsw.com/csm?id=kb_article&sysparm_article=KB0107185.



Note: The update to Microsoft Edge browser is very recent and the Knowledge Base article is not yet updated for the Microsoft Edge browser.

The CliffsNotes solution is as follows:

1. Open your browser and navigate to one of the following URLs based on your browser:
 - **Google Chrome:** <chrome://flags/#origin-agent-cluster-default>
 - **Microsoft Edge:** <edge://flags/#origin-agent-cluster-default>
2. From the dropdown of the highlighted parameter **Origin-keyed Agent Clusters by default**, select `Disabled`.
3. At the bottom of the page, click the **Apply Changes** button.
4. Log out of Unica applications, log back in, and verify if everything is working as expected.

Verifying the installation

After you install Unica Platform, verify that the installation is successful. The installation is successful if you can see the name of the Unica product in the **Configuration** list on the **Settings** page after you log in to Unica.

About this task

Complete the following steps to verify your Unica Platform installation:

1. Access the Unica URL by using Internet Explorer.

If you entered a domain when you installed, the URL is the following, where `host` is the machine where the Unica Platform is installed, `domain.com` is the domain in which the host machine resides, and `port` is the port number on which the web application server listens.

```
http://host.domain.com:port/unica
```

2. Log in using the default administrator login. The username for administrator login is `asm_admin`.

The first time you log in, the default value of user password is `password`. You are asked to change the password. You can enter the existing password, but you must choose a new one. You must change user's password when you verified your Unica Platform installation.

The default home page is the Dashboard, which is a blank page until dashboards are set up. See the *Unica Platform Installation Guide* for instructions about deploying the Dashboard WAR file.

3. Select **Settings > Configuration** and verify that **offer** is displayed in the list on the left.
4. **Optional:** Make the **Configuration Settings** page as your "home" page until you configure the dashboard. That way, a blank page is not displayed each time you log in.

Granting the `asm_admin` user access to Unica Centralized Offer Management

The default admin user (`asm_admin`) can access the Unica Centralized Offer Management configuration properties automatically. However, there are no default users with access to the Unica Centralized Offer Management application until you configure them.

About this task

Complete the following steps to grant the `asm_admin` user access to Unica Centralized Offer Management:

1. Create a group. For example, select **Settings > User groups > New Group** and set up **Default-Offers-Group**.
2. Assign the **OfferAdmin** and **OfferUser** roles to the group.

3. Assign the **asm_admin** user to the group.
4. Restart the application server.
5. Log back in as **asm_admin**.
6. Verify that you have access to Unica Centralized Offer Management features by selecting **Offer > Offers**.

Chapter 8. Multiple partitions in Unica Centralized Offer Management

In the Unica family of products, partitions provide a way to secure the data that is associated with different groups of users.

When you configure Unica Centralized Offer Management or a related Unica application to operate with multiple partitions, users can see each partition as a separate instance of the application. There is no indication that other partitions exist on the same computer.

How multiple partitions work

For the Unica applications that operate with Unica Centralized Offer Management, you can configure the application within the partitions where you have configured an instance of Unica Centralized Offer Management. Application users within each partition can access the Unica Campaign functions, data, and customer tables that are configured for Unica Campaign in the same partition.

Partition benefits

Multiple partitions are useful for setting up strong security between groups of users, because each partition has its own set of Unica Campaign system tables. Multiple partitions cannot be used when groups of users must share data.

Each partition has its own set of configuration settings, and Unica Campaign can be customized for each group of users. However, all partitions share the same installation binaries. With the same binaries for all partitions, you can minimize the installation and upgrade efforts for multiple partitions.

Partition user assignment

Access to partitions is managed through membership in Unica Platform groups.

Except for the partition superuser (`platform_admin`), each HCL user can belong to one partition. A user who requires access to multiple partitions must have a separate user account for each partition.

If there is only one partition, users do not have to be explicitly assigned to that partition to have access to Unica Campaign.

Partition data access

In a multi-partition configuration, partitions have the following security characteristics:

- A user cannot access a partition if the user is not a member of a group that is assigned to a partition.
- A user of one partition cannot view or change data in another partition.
- Users cannot navigate the Unica Campaign file system above the root directory of their partition from the browse dialog boxes in Unica Campaign. For example, if two partitions, named `partition1` and `partition2` exist, and you belong to the group that is associated with `partition1`, you cannot navigate the directory structure for `partition2` from a dialog box.

Configuring multiple partitions

Unica Centralized Offer Management has a seamless integration with Unica Campaign. During installation, if Campaign has multiple partitions, Unica Centralized Offer Management also configures the same number of partitions with the relevant data configured within the partitions. Post installation, if a user adds a new partition in Campaign, a new partition should be configured on Unica Centralized Offer Management.

If the user adds a new partition in Campaign, perform the following steps to create a similar partition on Unica Centralized Offer Management:

- a. On the **Configuration** page, navigate to **offer > partitions** and click *(partitionTemplate)*.

If you do not see the *(partitionTemplate)* property in the list, use the `configTool` utility to import the partition template using the following command:

```
configTool.bat -vp -p "Affinium" -f
"<Offer_Home>\conf\offers_configuration.xml"
```

Replace *OFFER_HOME* with the actual path to your Unica Centralized Offer Management installation.

The `configTool` utility is found in the `tools` directory under your Unica Platform installation. See the *Unica Platform Administrator's Guide* for information on using this utility.

Result

In the right pane, you see the **partitionTemplate** pane with an empty **New category name** field.

- b. Enter the name for the new partition, using the same name that you used when creating the partition's directory structure in Campaign.
- c. Click **Save Changes**.

Result

You see the new partition structure, with the same categories and properties as in the partition template.

Partition superuser

To administer security across all users of Unica Platform, a user account must exist that has access to all security settings and user accounts in the system.

By default, this user account is `platform_admin`. This user account does not belong to any one partition; instead, it has access to all user accounts in all partitions.

The administrator can create additional users with the same level of access. To be a partition superuser, an account must have Admin access to the Unica Platform and have full access to the Users, User Groups, and User Permissions pages.

Setting up system users for Unica Centralized Offer Management

On UNIX™, for the **Alternate Login** attribute of the system user, enter the UNIX™ name for a user in a group that shares privileges with the UNIX™ users of Unica Centralized Offer Management.



Note: If you have multiple partitions, you must create a system user for each partition.

Using Unica Insights Reports for multiple reports

If you want to use Unica Insights Reports for multiple partitions in Unica Campaign or Unica Interact, you must configure Unica Insights Reports package for each partition. For instructions, see the *Unica Insights Reports Installation and Configuration Guide*.

Assigning roles, permissions, and groups for partitions

Before you can use the partitions that you have configured for Unica Centralized Offer Management, you must assign roles to the user with administrator role in each partition. You must also assign a group to each partition.

Use the `partitionTool` utility to create a default admin user for each partition that you create.

Assign roles to each partition Admin user - The `partitionTool` utility creates a default Admin user for each partition you create. On the **Users** page, assign at least one security role (for example, Global Policy/Admin) and any Offer role to your new user. Once the new user has been assigned the role, you can log into the Unica Centralized Offer Management partition as that new user.

Chapter 9. Integration with Unica Insights Reports

Unica Centralized Offer Management supports integration with Unica Insights Reports. It does not support integration with IBM Cognos reports.

Unica Centralized Offer Management integrates with Unica Insights Reports, which is shipped with Unica Platform. Reporting relies on a set of reports for Centralized Offer Management application, which are installed with the Unica Platform installer.

For more details on how to install and configure Unica Insights Reports for Centralized Offer Management, see the *Unica Platform Installation Guide* and *Unica Insights Reports Installation and Configuration Guide*.

Chapter 10. Disable or Uninstall Unica Centralized Offer Management

You can choose to disable Unica Centralized Offer Management or uninstall it.

Disabling Unica Centralized Offer Management

You can choose to disable Unica Centralized Offer Management and continue using the Offer management feature of Unica Campaign.

About this task

To disable Centralized Offer Management, complete the following steps:

1. Select **Settings > Configuration**.
2. Select **Unica Platform**.
3. Click **Edit settings**.
4. For the **Enable Centralized offer management field**, set the value `NO`.
5. Click **Save**.



Note: After applying the changes, restart Unica Platform application.

Uninstalling Unica Centralized Offer Management

To uninstall Unica Centralized Offer Management, run the uninstaller. When you run the uninstaller, the files that were created during the installation process are removed. For example, files such as configuration files, installer registry information, and user data are removed from the computer.

About this task

When you install Unica products, an uninstaller is included in the `Uninstall_Product` directory, where *Product* is the name of your product. On Microsoft Windows, an entry is also added to the **Add or Remove Programs** list in the Control Panel.

If you manually remove the files in your installation directory instead of running the uninstaller, the result might be an incomplete installation if you later reinstall a product in the same location. After uninstalling a product, its database is not removed. The uninstaller only removes default files that are created during installation. Any file that is created or generated after installation is not removed.



Note: On UNIX, the same user account that installed Centralized Offer Management must run the uninstaller.

1. If you have deployed the Centralized Offer Management web application, undeploy the web application from your web application server.
2. Shut down web application server.
3. Stop the processes that are related to Centralized Offer Management.
4. Complete one of the following steps to uninstall Centralized Offer Management:

Choose from:

- Click the Unica Centralized Offer Management uninstaller that exists in the `Uninstall_Product` directory. The uninstaller runs in the mode in which you installed Unica Centralized Offer Management.
- In a command-line window, navigate to the directory where the uninstaller exists, and run the following command to uninstall Centralized Offer Management by using the console mode:

```
Uninstall_Product -i console
```

- In a command-line window, navigate to the directory where the uninstaller exists, and run the following command to uninstall Centralized Offer Management by using the silent mode:

```
Uninstall_Product -i silent
```

When you uninstall Centralized Offer Management, using the silent mode, the uninstallation process does not present any dialogs for user interaction.



Note: If you do not specify an option for uninstalling Centralized Offer Management, the uninstaller runs in the mode in which Centralized Offer Management is installed.

What to do next
