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# Chapter 1. System Requirements and Compatibility

## Chapter 2. About the Product

Unica Link provides both design-time and runtime services. It is invoked at design-time when an administrator configures a Link connection, or when you configure a process box in the Unica Campaign application, or a touchpoint in the Unica Journey application.

Unica Link is a component that can be installed separately from the Unica application. It must be installed in a Linux environment that can be remote from the Unica platform.

All options in `dtx.ini`, `hip-server.env`, and `tx-rest.properties` are now combined into a single `config.yaml` file for easier configuration.

In release 12.1.8, Unica Link:

- added support for Apache tomcat 9.0.82.
- LinkedIn connector, added the LinkedIn Version advanced property that is the Link API version with the default value.
- added JWT authentication as an alternative to certificate-based login for users. and need to configure those in the server section of the `config.yaml` file.
- updated the compatibility matrix for node JS20.
- Salesforce connector, added JWT bearer flow support.
- upgraded the multi partition utility for Linux Docker, Windows, and Linux Native.

Unica Link supports the following connectors:

- **Twitter connector** - The Twitter connector uploads contact information into an existing audience or new audience in Twitter.
- **Facebook AdTech** - The Facebook connector uploads contact information into an existing, or new audience in Facebook.
- **Google AdTech** - The Google Ads connector uploads contact information into an existing/new audience in Google Ads.
- **JDBC connector** - JDBC connector performs database operations like `insert`, `delete`, `update` and `upsert`. Additionally, it also executes SQL queries.
- **LinkedIn AdTech** - The LinkedIn connector uploads contact information into an existing, or new audience in LinkedIn.
- **Mailchimp connector** - The Mailchimp connector uploads contact information to an audience in Mailchimp, populating the merge field defined for the Audience. It then creates a segment of the audience for the uploaded contacts, and optionally runs or schedules a Mailchimp campaign to target the segment. The connector then polls Mailchimp on a scheduled basis to gather the results of the campaign, and to report back whether emails were delivered, bounced, opened or links clicked within the emails.
- **Mandrill connector** - The Mandrill connector sends email using a defined template on a Mandril account, populating the merge field defined in that template. The connector then polls Mandrill to report whether emails were bounced, opened, or links clicked within the email.

- **Salesforce connector** - Salesforce (CRM) saves and updates details about users. Salesforce supports two operations, 'Create' and 'Update', as well as two objects 'Lead' and 'Contact'. Also supported are two objects, 'Lead' and 'Contact'.
- **Twilio connector** - The Twilio connector sends SMS to a destination device and fetches the status of the sent SMS.

## Chapter 3. Defect Articles

The following issues were fixed in the 12.1.8 release of Unica Link:

- An issue was fixed that prevented customer editing previously configured touchpoints after changing a connector's name within a journey's settings.
- An issue was fixed for "Token" property where you can enter your token URL was not shown if the "Action Token Expiry Action" was set to "JWT Token".
- An issue was fixed for Link Executor Pod scaling.
- An issue was fixed related to redesigning master SQLite database structure to reference packages.
- An issue was fixed for security vulnerability detected in NodeJS.
- An issue was fixed related to listener performance while running the Link Process.

# Chapter 4. Known Limitations

The following table lists the known limitations in Unica Link 12.1.8:

Product	Description
Mailchimp connector	Mailchimp response API has a limitation to report only maximum 1000 email records at a specific time. Refer to the element (List email activity---->count) on Mailchimp API link (response API to capture email activities) - <a href="https://-mailchimp.com/developer/marketing/api/email-activity-reports/">https://-mailchimp.com/developer/marketing/api/email-activity-reports/</a>
Mandrill connector	The User Mail Open/Click responses are available on the Mandrill site only, post a delay ranging from 10 to 15 hours.  This is a limitation of the Mandrill service.
JDBC Connector	No select Query in RAW SQL.
JDBC Connector	Database drivers comply only with JDBC 4.2 or later specifications.
JDBC Connector	Only <code>INSERT</code> , <code>DELETE</code> , <code>UPDATE</code> , and <code>UPSERT</code> operations can be performed on the Table option.

## Chapter 5. Known issues

The following table lists the known issues in Unica Link 12.1.8:

Product	Description
Link	Removing a Unica application does not remove the artifacts created for the application.
Mandrill connector	In Mandrill, non-Latin alphabetic characters are not supported in Merge fields.
Mandrill connector	This issue involves, <b>Email Delivered</b> and <b>Email Sent</b> events which are not received for Mandrill.
JDBC Connector	JDBC connector will automatically truncate the input data if it exceeds the size of the database field.  For example, If the input data is 20 characters in length and the database field length is 15 characters, Link will only write first 15 characters into the database field.
Facebook AdTech Connector	The Connection is failing. If the returned status is 400, with the response <pre>{"error":{"message":"(#2635), you are using an out of date Ads API version. Please update to the latest version v12.0."}}</pre> <b>Workaround:</b>  Update the Base URL connection property on UI to include the correct version as stated in the error message. The Base URL/Version format is as follows: <pre>https://&lt;FB site&gt;/&lt;Version&gt;</pre> <b>Example:</b> <pre>https://graph.facebook.com/v11.0</pre> So, if your base URL is <pre>https://graph.facebook.com/v11.0</pre> and you click the test connection, it shows the earlier mentioned error message, and it says to use v12.0, then update it in base-URL as follows: <pre>https://graph.facebook.com/v12.0</pre>
Twitter Connector	While creating new connection, base-URL <pre>https://ads-api.twitter.com/10</pre> is not working as it has been deprecated by Twitter. Functionality is working fine with <pre>https://ads-api.twitter.com/12</pre> .
LinkedIn Connector	The <code>LinkedIn Version</code> connection property has a default value. The default value is valid for a year.  If the property value is expired, set the latest <code>LinkedIn Version</code> on the connection screen to avoid the error.
